



# WPU On-Campus Random Required Testing Clinic FAQs

WPU will be **implementing on-campus random required COVID-19 testing throughout the semester**. We will also offer testing to those who want to self-select this option. Below are Frequently Asked Questions about the On-Campus Testing Clinic.

**NOTE:** *Students who do not comply with the initial request for testing will receive a written warning and will have 7-days to comply with the initial request for testing. Further non compliance after this warning can result in University probation up to removal from housing, and will be at the discretion of the Student Conduct office.*

**Q: What type of COVID-19 test is used on-campus and how long does it take to get results?**

**A:** We will be administering a Rapid Antigen Testing which is a rapid diagnostic test that detects the results in 15 minutes. Please plan to be at the Testing Clinic for at least 30 minutes to be tested and await your results.

**Q: Where and when does on-campus testing take place?**

**A:** The On-Campus testing will be held in the large white tent behind Joyner House.

- **Required testing for randomly selected students** will be conducted every Tuesday and Thursday from 1 to 3:30 PM. Students will have the opportunity to sign up for convenient times using the link within the communication they receive. Communication is sent out on Fridays at 3 PM (each week).
- **Optional testing for self-selected students**, faculty and staff will be conducted every Wednesday from 1 to 3 PM, please sign up by clicking [here](#).

**Q: Is there a fee to use the On-Campus Testing Clinic?**

**A:** No, the on-campus testing is free to all students, faculty, and staff. The intent is to ensure that we can identify any health concerns before they impact our on-campus experience.

**Q: Am I required to get tested on-campus during the semester?**

**A:** The University will be conducting the required testing using random, computer-generated testing groups. If you are selected for the required testing, you will be notified via email on the Friday (at 3PM) prior to your required testing day/s.

**Q: If I have symptoms of COVID-19, am I able to use the On-Campus Testing Clinic?**

**A:** No, if you are experiencing symptoms, please contact Health Services ASAP. You will need to be tested at an off campus location. Please email [Healthservices@peace.edu](mailto:Healthservices@peace.edu) for a list of local testing sites.

**Q: I have had known exposure to COVID-19. Can I get tested on-campus?**

**A:** No, if you have known exposure please contact Health Services ASAP. You will need to be tested at an off campus location. Please email [Healthservices@peace.edu](mailto:Healthservices@peace.edu) for a list of local testing sites.

**Q: What will I need to do if I get a positive test result at the On-Campus Testing Clinic?**

**A:** If the Rapid Antigen test is positive, you will need to go and be tested using a PCR or lab test to confirm your results. You will need to isolate while awaiting those results. Health Services will provide you a list of local testing sites.

**Q: How do I sign up for optional/self-selected on-campus testing?**

**A:** If you would like to participate in the optional testing, please sign up by clicking [here](#). Testing will be on Wednesday from 1 to 3PM.
